APPLICATION FOR HAZARDOUS MATERIAL MANAGEMENT FACILITY LICENSE

Hazardous materials are any substance or mixture of substances which pose a potential risk to water supplies, the environment, or to public health and safety, as defined in Section 27-352 of the Broward County Code. Some examples are petroleum products, solvents, paints, batteries, coolant, used oil and filters, brake and transmission fluids, and pesticides. A business that uses, stores, handles or generates twenty-five (25) gallons or more of hazardous materials (all total) within a month requires a license.
